## The End Beginning



### Violinist – Renaud Capucon

- The great violinist Renaud Capuçon played the first notes in the hall of the Philharmonie de Paris;
- "I had the opportunity and honor, as a violin soloist, playing the first musical notes issued in this magnificent hall of the Philharmonie de Paris, at rehearsal. This will remain one of the highlights of my life as a musician. I was almost afraid, but I was immediately won over: the acoustics are bright, very natural; about the sound texture, it is clear and round. I had a feeling of comfort. I felt surrounded by music, it is the nature of the scenes set in the heart of the room. When it was the turn of the orchestra to play, I found that all the instruments were remarkably enhanced. The proximity of sensation is extraordinary. Everything is done so that the artist feels good. Certainly there will be some small adjustments to be made, but for now, this sublime room already sounds great. This is more than ready. As you see, I'm excited!


